**RECOMMENDATION:**

Adoption of Site Specific Board Determination No. C2016-05, as proposed, granting Fund Coverage to Chevron Station for two underground storage tank systems whose releases are comingled with a non-Fund eligible release source, resulting in a 20% Coverage reduction and a 10% copayment, with the option to petition the Board for a retroactive reduction of the Coverage Reduction if new, and scientifically defensible information is provided to NDEP that identifies the actual contribution of non-Fund eligible contamination to be less than 20%.

**10. ADOPTION OF AMENDED POLICY RESOLUTION No. 2012-06 – RECONSIDERATION OF AN APPROVED BOARD DETERMINATION (FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

The Board approved Policy Resolution 2012-06 in June 2012. Policy Resolution 2012-06 provides criteria for NDEP to use as guidance when recommending that the Board reconsiders a past Board Determination. During the most recent Board meeting held in June 2016, the Board reconsidered a past Board Determination using criteria not currently present in Policy Resolution 2012-06, specifically, the implementation of a NDEP-approved *Compliance Plan and Schedule* that will expedite the cleanup of a site. NDEP informed the Board it would amend Policy Resolution No. 2012-06 to include the new criteria for Board adoption during the September 2016 Board meeting.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Adoption of amended Policy Resolution No. 2012-06, incorporating a NDEP-approved *Compliance Plan and Schedule* as additional criteria for NDEP to utilize when recommending the Board reconsider a previous Board Determination.

**11. PROPOSED UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK REGULATION AMENDMENTS BRIEFING (DISCUSSION)**

Mr. Jonathan McRae, supervisor of the UST/LUST program, will brief the Board on the proposed regulation amendments associated with the Underground Storage Tank (UST) program. The UST regulatory petition will be presented to the State Environmental Commission for adoption on October 12, 2016.
