Re: Response to NDOW Comments to the Jungo Disposal Site

Dear Mr. Freese:

This letter is in response to your correspondence dated October 5, 2010 and our conversation on March 1, 2011. Enclosed is a copy of the most recent Plan of Operations (Revision 4, April 2011) and Report of Design (Revision 5, April 2011) for the Jungo Disposal Site (“Jungo”). These documents were recently submitted to the Nevada Department of Environmental Protection (“NDEP”) as part of Jungo’s application for a Solid Waste Disposal Site Permit. Consistent with our conversation on March 1, 2011, Jungo has incorporated your comments from your October 5, 2010 letter into the above reference application documents.

Specifically, the following areas in the Report of Design and Plan of Operations have been revised in response to your comments:

- Section 8.0 of the Plan of Operations has been revised to discuss control of odors,
- Section 9.0 of the Plan of Operations has been revised to indicate that cover material will be used at the end of each operating day.
- Section 2.3.5.5 of the Report of Design has been revised to indicate that a copy of the sampling results from the lined surface run-off impoundment will be provided to NDOW.
- Section 7.0 and Section 13.3 of the Plan of Operations has been revised to discuss access to the active area, and to specify fencing.
- Section 2.3.5.2 of the Report of Design has been revised to specify that revegetation test plots will be constructed upon completion of the first cell to evaluate revegetation success, in consultation with NDOW.
- Section 8.0 of the Plan of Operations has been revised to discuss monitoring of weedy species.
