Public Notice

The Administrator of the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection is issuing this Notice of Proposed Action under the Nevada Revised Statutes and the U.S. Clean Water Act. The Administrator has received a complete application to renew National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit # NV0023094 from the following applicant:

Union 76 Service Station # 4616 at 530 N Las Vegas Blvd, at the intersection of Bonanza Rd, has groundwater contamination due to a leaking underground storage tank system. Extraction wells feed an air stripper that discharges to Las Vegas Wash via the adjacent storm drain on N Las Vegas Blvd. The Division has made the tentative determination to renew the proposed NPDES permit for discharge of air stripper effluent to the storm drain.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determination by the Administrator, or request a hearing pursuant to the water pollution control provisions of the Nevada Administrative Code, should submit their comments or request in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication either in person or by mail to:

The end of the comment period and deadline for receipt of all comments or requests in this office is 5:00 P.M. Monday March 14, 2005. Mail postmarked with that date will also be accepted. Hearing requests must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30)

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day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time. The application, proposed permit, comments received, and other information are on file and may be copied or copies may be obtained by writing to the above address or by calling Robert J.
