## Notice of Proposed Action

June 4, 2008

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received an application for renewal of zero-discharge permit # NEV91006 from the following applicant:

Franktown Meadows Equestrian Center  
4200 Old Hwy. 395  
Washoe Valley, NV 89704

The applicant operates an equestrian center in Washoe Valley, Washoe County, Nevada. The facility operates a 1,500 gallon per day capacity package wastewater treatment plant for the treatment of domestic (sanitary) wastewater generated by two caretaker residences and restrooms located inside the equestrian center building. The package treatment plant incorporates primary (settling) and secondary (biological) wastewater treatment processes. The treated effluent is discharged to a clay-lined holding pond for evaporation. The Division has made the tentative determination to issue (renew) the proposed zero-discharge permit for a period of five (5) years.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or request, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, hand-delivered, e-mailed, faxed or postmarked no later than 5:00 P.M. PST on Monday, July 7, 2008, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed

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permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time. The application, proposed permit, comments received, and other information are on file and may be copied or copies may be obtained by writing to the above address or by calling Mark A.
