### **REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON ALLOWABLE REMEDIATION WASTE AT THE PERMITTED BRC CORRECTIVE ACTION MANAGEMENT UNIT**

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) is soliciting public comment on allowable remediation wastes for disposal at the Basic Remediation Company (BRC) Corrective Action Management Unit (CAMU) landfill located in Clark County, Nevada. On September 24, 2007, the NDEP issued a Remedial Action Plan (RAP) or PERMIT to BRC to construct, operate and close the CAMU which is located within the boundaries of the Common Areas at the Basic Management Incorporated (BMI) Industrial Complex in Clark County. The PERMIT authorizes BRC to manage and dispose of soils contaminated with hazardous constituents regulated by state and federal regulations in accordance with the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). The permitted CAMU is designed to receive approximately 3.3 million cubic yards of remediation waste and meets the design criteria for a RCRA hazardous waste landfill, including an engineered and leak-detected liner, leachate collection system and protective cover system. The CAMU is integral to the overall environmental remediation and restoration strategy selected for the BMI Industrial Complex and Common Areas.

The PERMIT issued in 2007 contemplated management of remediation waste from adjacent areas within the BMI Complex which were not specifically identified in the original permit application provided that prior approval is granted by the NDEP. It is now projected that the constructed BRC landfill will have excess capacity to allow the acceptance of CAMU-eligible remediation wastes from adjacent areas within the BMI Complex and the NDEP has received a request from BRC to allow additional contaminated soils from those areas. The original design capacity of the landfill will not change and the terms and conditions of the PERMIT will remain unchanged. However, the existing PERMIT employs the use of adjusted standards for the acceptance of a portion of the remediation wastes that are currently being placed in the CAMU, and it is anticipated that a very limited portion of the wastes from the adjacent properties may require modification of the existing adjusted standards governing the concentration of specific wastes allowed for disposal.

In consideration of the request, the NDEP is soliciting public comment in regards to any benefits or concerns the public may perceive or identify as a result of approving the additional remediation waste. Anyone wishing to submit comments on the proposed change should do so in writing on or before November 9, 2009 to the NDEP- Carson City address noted below.
