## Public Notice

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received a complete application for renewal of water pollution control discharge permit #NEV2010512 from the following applicant:

Diversified Concrete Cutting  
59 Coney Island Drive  
Sparks, NV 89431

The applicant proposes to dry concrete cuttings slurry generated from road work in California and Nevada into a two double lined pond system located at the Tahoe Reno Industrial Center in Storey County. The pond systems will be operated as a zero discharge operation with a leak detection system in place for the primary liner, 60 mil thick HDPE. Dried cement sludge will be removed from the ponds and hauled to an approved concrete processing facility for reuse.

On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) as amended, and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to renew the permit to discharge, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or request, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, by January 14, 2011 either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

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The application, proposed permit, comments received, and other information are on file and may be copied or copies may be obtained by writing to the above address or by calling Joe Maez, Bureau of Water Pollution Control at 775.687.9431 or by FAX at 775 687-4684. If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations.
