## Public Notice

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes and the Federal Clean Water Act. The Administrator has received an application of National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit, #NV0023990, from the following applicant:

The City of Las Vegas Public Works (CLVPW) is proposing to make improvements to the Langtry Channel, which will require dewatering discharge. The project involves installation of approximately 1,260 linear feet of 18" diameter reinforced concrete pipe and reinforced concrete liner in the bottom of the existing concrete-lined channel, and tie into existing reinforced concrete box culverts at each end of the channel reach. The project extends between Bonanza Road and West Washington Ave. just west of S. Valley View Blvd., in Las Vegas, Clark County. This project will require construction and dewatering. Dewatering is expected to be needed for less than one year, beginning in February, 2011. Shallow groundwater will be pumped from approximately 4 well points, to sediment settling tanks prior to discharge to the Clark County stormdrain system and ultimately to the Las Vegas Wash. The storm drain drop inlet is located within Bonanza Road. The maximum daily flow will be permitted at 173.6 gallons per minute equivalent to 0.250 million gallons per day. The proposed NPDES permit is for a period of five years although the construction and discharge activities are expected to be completed in a much shorter time period.

Based on a review of the NPDES permit application, the Division has made the tentative determination to issue the NPDES permit for a period of five (5) years.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, should submit their comments or request, in writing or by Fax, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, by 5:00 P.M. on January 12, 2011, either in person or by mail to:

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Comments and/or hearing requests received via facsimile or e-mail before 5:00 P.M. on January 12, 2011 will also be accepted. All requests for hearings must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reason(s) why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day comment period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. The public notice of such hearings will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the public hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations.

Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
