## NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received a complete renewal application for groundwater discharge permit NEV92037 from the following applicant:

**Homestretch Geothermal 2010, LLC  
611 West 1760 North  
Washington, UT 84780**

The applicant owns and operates the Wabuska Power Plant (WPP), a 2.0 megawatt power generating facility located approximately 12 miles north of Yerington, in Lyon County. WPP uses extracted geothermal water in the operation of their facility. The non-contact process water is currently discharged to an alkali flat and a water-ski lake located east of the facility, and to a wetland area located west of US 95A. In addition to these locations, Homestretch Geothermal may begin diverting a portion of their non-contact process water to a proposed meat processing plant that will be located south of power plant.

The Division has made the tentative determination to renew the permit for a period of five (5) years.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determination by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or requests, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, hand-delivered or postmarked no later than **5:00 P.M. on October 26, 2012**, either in person or by mail to:

Comments and/or hearing requests received via facsimile or e-mail before **5:00 P.M. October 26, 2012**, will also be accepted. All requests for hearings must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reason(s) why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day comment period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. The public notice of such hearings will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the public hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time. The application, proposed permit, comments received, and other information are on file and may be copied or copies may be obtained by writing to the above address or by contacting Art Marr, Bureau of Water Pollution Control at (775) 687-9432, or at [amarr@ndep.nv.gov](mailto:amarr@ndep.nv.gov).
