



NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the authority of the Nevada Revised Statutes, the Nevada Administrative Code, and the Safe Drinking Water Act.

The Administrator has received an application to modify underground injection control (UIC) permit UNEV93216, which has been drafted for public comment, from the Permittee:

The Administrator has prepared tentative determinations regarding the permit which, in brief, are:

UIC permit UNEV93216 will be modified to 1) increase the number of injection wells for three (3) to five (5) for activities related to water produced in conjunction with conventional oil production, and 2) increase the locations of where these injection wells may be located. The wells are located in portions of sections 22, 28, 33, 34, 35 and 36, T9N, R57E and portions of sections 1 and 2, T8N, R57E, Nye County, Nevada. The injection zones have been characterized as hydrocarbon-producing zones, and the water chemistry is similar to the injectate. Injection pressures will not exceed that allowable by regulation.

On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the Nevada Revised Statutes, the Nevada Administrative Code, and the Safe Drinking Water Act, and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to modify UIC Permit UNEV93216 as stated above.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance or to request a hearing pursuant to Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or request in writing by July 19, 2013 either in person or by mail to:

All comments or objections received within thirty days of newspaper publication will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty days prior to the hearing date.
