

## **Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments for Proposed Amendments to Nevada Administrative Code Chapter 444 - Hazardous Waste Regulations**

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) is proposing to modify state hazardous waste regulations. The proposed revisions will delete obsolete references, correct technical errors and clarify existing state regulations to make them more consistent with federal regulations. **Proposed Permanent Regulation R091-16:** The proposed amendments to Nevada's existing hazardous waste regulations will: 1) replace multiple unnecessary references to the current adoption by reference date of July 1, 2008 with a general reference to NAC 444.8632; 2) add a subpart of federal regulations relating to the standardized application and issuance of hazardous waste permits to correct an inadvertent omission; 3) clarify existing financial requirements applicable to hazardous waste facilities; and 4) delete references to obsolete financial requirements not applicable to the State of Nevada. These amendments clarify and provide only technical corrections to existing hazardous waste regulations and do not increase regulatory oversight of hazardous waste facilities.
