Notes:

1. The Nevada State Health Division has issued a fish consumption advisory based on the Federal Drug Administration mercury action level of >1.0 mg/kg (wet weight).
2. The Carson River from New Empire to the Carson Sink is included on the National Priorities List (Superfund) due to mercury contamination from historic mining activities.
3. Waterbody listed for mercury in water column for the beneficial use of aquatic life*.

*Aquatic Life standard set at 1-hour average 1.4 µg/l and the 96-hour average 0.77µg/l (One-hour average and 96-hour average concentration limits may be exceeded only once every 3 years).
