The Goal

Assessments

- Level 1
 - 40 Systems
 - 2 due to late repeats
- Level 2
 - 12 Assessments
 - 6 Systems

Seasonal Systems

- Seasonal Start-up
 - BSDW 23
 - SNHD 6
 - WCHD 4

The Numbers

- One system inactivated
- One system did not serve water
- One system increased to year-round operation

3 violations for failing to complete start-up



The Seasonal Skinny

- Advance thought and preparation
- Understand approved Start-up SOP
 - Where to take samples
 - Disinfection
- Shutdown procedure
- Time allowed for procedures and review

What worked?

- Creating the start-up procedure and sending in the checklist at the same time.
- Starting to serve before approval given
- Calling on Friday for opening on Monday
 - "What do you want me to do?"
 - "Can I have an extension?"
 - Really?

What didn't work?

- Take a few minutes to review SOP and decide if anything should be done differently.
- Give BSDW/SNHD/WCHD time to review and approve checklist.
- Include coliform results with checklist.
- Initial samples NOT compliance monitoring
- Allow time for compliance sampling the month of opening.

Always think ahead

- Level of Effort
 - Sampling error
 - Weather conditions

The Assessments

- Are you sure?
- Did you
 - Glance?
 - Leave your office?
 - Scrutinize?
 - Get Dirty?

No Problems?

- "No problem found" was not common
- When it was found, seemed to be true

In fact

- Regulation allows rejecting the L1 Assessment Request additional information
- Regulator may request further investigation
 New 30-day clock
- Investigatory samples may be needed

Going Forward

- Sampling Error
 - Protocol
 - Location
- Maintenance
 - Disinfect after modifications
 - Treatment operations
- Old pressure tank
- Cross connection
- Water age

Some Level 1 Defects

- Question Staff
- Review activities, maintenance, SOPs, schedules
- Number ONE: Little or NO disinfection following maintenance 8
- Number TWO: Treatment system (changes, maintenance, ignored) 5

Thoroughness is Key

- Several a combination of One and Two
- Chlorination needed or not maintained (4)
- Sampling location or protocol (3)
- Cross connection (1)

Other findings

- Maintenance (11)
 - Disinfect after modifications
 - Treatment operations
- All triggered by multiple coliform events
- 2 Systems Multiple Level 2s
 - Ongoing treatment issues
 - Unsafe well and poor communication

Some Level 2 Defects

- Transient Non-Community (8)
 - Maintenance
 - Lack of understanding
- Community (3)
 - Poor well construction
 - · Lack of funds
 - · Lack of communication

System Characteristics

- Training
- Engineering
- Chlorination
- Treatment Maintenance/Replacement

Solutions

Flow direction or pressure changes

Water age AND pipe sediments

Potholing and Pressure testing




