## DEACTIVATION OF EPA IDENTIFICATION NUMBER

To deactivate your EPA Identification Number (ID#) you must submit a letter to the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection. The letter must be written on company letterhead paper and include the following information:

- (1) The name of the facility;
- (2) The site address (not mailing address) of the facility;
- (3) The EPA ID# associated with the site;
- (4) A statement indicating that you wish to deactivate the ID#;
- (5) The reason for the deactivation request (i.e., hazardous waste is no longer generated at the site, the business has moved to a new location, etc.);
- (6) The approximate date that the generator status changed from a generator to a non-generator (i.e., the date the business moved, closed or stopped generating); and
- (7) An original signature of the owner or operator.
