## NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

September 13, 2006 - web posting date

The Administrator of the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection is issuing this Notice of Proposed Action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received a complete application to renew Water Pollution Control Discharge Permit # NEV2000502 from the following applicant.

Tahoe Reno Industrial Center General Improvement District  
9476 Double R Blvd Ste A  
Reno NV 89521

This would be the first renewal of a permit originally issued in 2000 for operation of the wastewater treatment plant serving the Tahoe Reno Industrial Center, located near the Truckee River in Storey County. Industrial discharges to the collection system are subject to a pretreatment program administered by the GID. The plant discharge evaporates in a lined storage reservoir which will eventually supply a landscape irrigation system. The renewed permit will accommodate an upcoming expansion to 1.2 MGD.

The Administrator has made a determination to propose renewal of the permit. Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determination, or request a hearing pursuant to the water pollution control provisions of the Nevada Administrative Code, should submit their comments or request in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication either in person or by mail to:

The end of the comment period and deadline for receipt of all comments or requests in this office is 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday October 24, 2006. Mail postmarked with that date will also be accepted. Hearing requests must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time. The application, proposed permit, comments received, and other information are on file and may be copied or copies may be obtained by writing to the above address or by calling Robert J.
