Description of Proposed

The applicant has requested a Permit to operate a Compost Plant, and the NDEP has tentatively approved the quantity of compostable feedstock¹, intermediate product² and finished product³ at the site. Bently Agrowdynamics will accept Biosolids and other compostables from various Sanitation Districts within Nevada and the adjacent state of California, and Agricultural and Residential sources. The material will be composted to meet specific standards for conversion into an agricultural product for use as a soil amendment for the associated agricultural operation.

Location:

Bently Farm 1089 Stockyard Road [T13N R20E S21] Minden NV 89423

Description and Design of the Site

The 23 acre parcel occupied by the Compost Plant site is Agricultural land located within the confines of the Bently agricultural operation in Minden NV. The facility will be operated as a windrow operation and will consist of multiple windrows, approximately fifteen hundred (1,500) feet long by six (6) feet high. The Compost Plant will accept Biosolids, wood chips, straw manure, wood waste and green material.

Proposed Action

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection intends to issue a compost plant Permit to Bently Agrowdynamics to operate the facility as described in the application and this Fact Sheet.

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection's Notice of Intent to issue a permit authorizing the operation of this facility, subject to the conditions contained in the permit, will be published in the Record Courier. Additionally, the Public Notice will be mailed to interested persons on our mailing list. The Division will accept written comments and written requests for a public hearing on the draft permit from all interested persons. Written requests for a public hearing must state the nature of the issues which the requester intends to raise at the hearing. Written requests for a public hearing and written comments on the draft permit will be accepted until the end of the public comment period. The Division may extend the period for public review, as necessary.

Will there be a public hearing?

The Division may schedule a public hearing on its own initiative or based on receipt of a written request received during the public comment period. Any interested person may submit a written request to the Division for a public hearing on the proposed action. Any request must state the nature of the issues which the requester intends to raise. If a hearing is scheduled, the Division will notify all persons who are on the mailing list or who have submitted written comments on the proposed action.

When does the comment period end?

The 30-day comment period ends December 19th, 2007. Anyone wishing to comment should do so in writing prior to this date. The Division may extend the comment period as it deems necessary.
