The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action in accordance with Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received a complete application for new groundwater discharge Permit NEV2007504 from:

STALLION MOUNTAIN COUNTRY CLUB

LAS VEGAS, CLARK COUNTY, NEVADA 89122

Permit NEV2007504 will authorize the use of reclaimed water received from the City of Las Vegas Water Pollution Control Facility (Permit #NV0020133) for irrigation of the Stallion Mountain Country Club golf course and associated landscaping at a flow rate up to 3.5 million gallons per day. At a minimum, reclaimed water is treated to meet tertiary standards and chlorine disinfected prior to distribution for reuse. Groundwater monitoring and discharge monitoring requirements are stipulated in the proposed permit. Upon issuance, the permit will be in effect for a five (5) year period.

Based on preliminary review of Nevada Revised Statutes and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to issue the permit to discharge, subject to the limitations and conditions imposed. Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or request, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, closing at 5:00 P.M. on February 12, 2007, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received by 5:00 P.M. on February 12, 2007 will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing.

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A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
