The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received an application for renewal and modification of discharge permit # NEV89011 from the following applicant:

Paradise Valley Sewer District

Paradise Valley, NV 89426

The Permittee operates the Paradise Valley Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF), which is located three-quarter miles south of town on State Route 290. The WWTF, originally constructed in 1975 and later modified in 2007, includes a community septic tank, lined treatment pond and percolation basin for discharge of treated effluent. The permitted treatment capacity of the WWTF is 0.005 million gallons per day of domestic wastewater (i.e., 5,000 GPD). The effluent and groundwater quality are sampled and reported quarterly to ensure that the facility is operating within the permit conditions. The Division has made the tentative determination to issue (renewal and modification) the proposed discharge permit for a period of five (5) years.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or request, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, hand-delivered, e-mailed, faxed or postmarked no later than 5:00 P.M. PST on Monday, January 12, 2009, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
