PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received an application for renewal of water pollution control discharge permit # NEV92028 from:

Sparks, Washoe County, NV 89434

The applicant operates a used oil recycling facility, which separates the moisture impurity from a fuel oil product sold for use in industrial furnaces. For process wastewater hydrocarbon removal, the facility operates an existing treatment system consisting of oil emulsion formation and separation, vacuum filtration and carbon adsorption, limited to a discharge flow rate of not more than 2,750 gallons per day. Actual flow averaged less than 600 gallons daily. Treated effluent is used at a neighboring property for dust abatement during reclamation activities at a former automotive wrecking yard. The Division's permit requires the treated effluent to meet the applicable State guidelines for hydrocarbon remediation. The Division does not anticipate an adverse impact from dust control using effluent quality at the required limits and routinely permits such discharges Statewide at other permitted facilities as a water conservation measure and means of dust control. The Division has made the tentative determination to issue (renew) the proposed discharge permit for a period of five (5) years.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or request, in writing, within thirty (30) calendar days of the date of the paper publication, hand-delivered, e-mailed, faxed or postmarked no later than 5:00 P.M. PST on Monday, November 9, 2009, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
