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**Summary:**

The Clean Water State Revolving Loan Fund (CWSRF) program began in 1989 and is administered by the Division of Environmental Protection. Using capitalization grants from USEPA, State match funds and loan repayments, the program provides low cost financing of municipal wastewater treatment infrastructure projects that are necessary to protect public health. Existing State and Federal statutes and regulations govern the program. Proposed projects are solicited annually. Eligible projects are then ranked in terms of their importance to public health and placed in a State Priority List.

ARRA funds have provided supplemental program funding, though there are unique provisions related to ARRA funded projects. At least 50% of the ARRA grant must be awarded as loan subsidies, in the form of grants, principal forgiveness or negative interest loans. The Division chose to implement this provision by providing loans with principal forgiveness (essentially grants) to projects serving disadvantaged communities, defined as those with a median household income of 80% or less than the Statewide median household income. All other ARRA loans will be provided at a 0% interest rate. ARRA also requires that 20% of grant funds be used to support "green" infrastructure projects. The Division has established a Priority List for ARRA projects and is awarding loan contracts based on a project's priority and readiness to proceed.
