## **PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION**

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received a complete application for renewal of a water pollution control discharge permit (NEV2004516) from the following applicant:

Georgia-Pacific Gypsum Corporation

North Las Vegas, Nevada 89033

Georgia-Pacific Corporation proposes to discharge a heavily mineralized water waste stream resulting from cooling tower blowdown and dehydration processes associated with the production of gypsum wallboard, to a lined evaporation pond at the facility which is located at 11401 N. U.S. Highway 91 at Apex, Nevada. The facility is located:

Latitude: 36° 20' 40.35"N; Longitude: 114° 55' 21.23"W.  
Section 34, T. 18S., R. 63E. MDB & M,

The renewal proposed permit will be for a period of (5) five years. On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to renew the permit to discharge, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control should submit their comments or request, in writing, by phone or Fax within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, by **MARCH 8, 2010**, either in person or by mail to

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within thirty (30) days will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
