PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes

The Administrator has received a complete application to renew permit #NEV2004530, a water pollution control discharge permit from the following applicant:

City of Sparks

Sparks, Nevada 89434

The Permittee proposes to supply and manage tertiary treated denitrified disinfected effluent to irrigate streetscapes and common areas at the following developments: The Vineyards, Barcelona Crossing, Kiley West including the Spanish Springs Sports Complex, the Foothills, Pioneer Meadows, HAWCO Business Park, and Calle de La Plata. The Pioneer Meadows development will have turf grass irrigation at two small parks and a school in addition to streetscapes irrigation. The HAWCO Business Park landscape irrigation is also included in the permit, as well as a truck fill station for construction water use at Disc Drive. The Permittee will use effluent from the Truckee Meadows Water Reclamation Facility (NEV2003506) for the subject reuse sites in accordance with conditions in the approved Effluent Management Plans required by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection, and by the terms and condition of the permit. The permit will be issued for period of the five (5) years.

On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to issue and renew the subject permit to discharge, subject to certain effluent limitations and special conditions.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance and reissuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control should submit their comments or request, in writing by **April 9, 2010**, within thirty (30) days of newspaper publication, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted.

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All comments or objections received within thirty (30) days of publication of the notice will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
