PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received an application for the renewal of discharge permit # NEV90006 from the following applicant:

The Town of Orovada (pop. 154) operates a community pond wastewater treatment system located in Orovada, Humboldt County, Nevada. The treatment facility presently consists of one pond and an infiltration basin. An upgrade is being planned, which would include pond lining. The proposed effluent limitations require demonstration of secondary (biological) pond treatment standards at the point of discharge to the groundwater. The present facility capacity is rated 20,000 gallons per day, and the current flow rate is 6,000 gallons per day. The Division has made the tentative determination to issue the proposed permit conditions to the applicant for a period of five (5) years.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control should submit their comments or request, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, hand-delivered, e-mailed, faxed or postmarked no later than 5:00 P.M. PST on Monday, March 28, 2011, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time. The application, proposed permit, comments received, and other information are on file and may be copied or copies may be obtained by writing to the above address or by calling Mark A.
