NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS). The Administrator has received a complete renewal application for a water pollution control discharge permit, NEV94017, from the following applicant:

The Nevada Department of Corrections operates Pioche Conservation Camp (PCC), a minimum-security men's prison camp, which is located approximately one and one-half miles northeast of Pioche, Nevada in Lincoln County. The PCC is designed for a population of 196 inmates. The wastewater treatment system consists of a two-cell (primary treatment/polishing pond) lined pond with mechanical aeration. The secondary-treated effluent from the polishing portion of the pond is discharged to groundwaters of the State via rapid infiltration basins and a leach field.

On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the NRS as amended, and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to reissue the permit for a five (5) year period, subject to specific effluent limitations and monitoring requirements.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or request, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, closing at **5:00 P.M. on May 21, 2012**, either in person or by mail to:

Requests must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
