NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes. The Administrator has received a complete renewal application for groundwater discharge permit NS0094012, formerly NEV94012, from the following applicant:

The applicant operates a facultative pond wastewater treatment system located one mile north-northeast of the town of Baker, in White Pine County. The system consists of two (2) clay-lined primary treatment ponds and one (1) unlined secondary percolation/evaporation pond. Due to lower than expected influent flows, the northern primary pond has been abandoned and the secondary percolation/evaporation pond has not received effluent. The facility is designed to treat a maximum influent flow rate of 0.045 million gallons per day (MGD). Current average influent flows are 0.02 MGD.

The Division has made the tentative determination to renew the permit for a period of five (5) years.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance, or request a hearing pursuant to the Nevada Administrative Code, Water Pollution Control, should submit their comments or requests, in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of newspaper publication, hand-delivered or postmarked no later than **5:00 P.M. on December 10, 2012**, either in person or by mail to:

Comments and/or hearing requests received via facsimile or e-mail before **5:00 P.M. on December 10, 2012**, will also be accepted. All requests for hearings must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reason(s) why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day comment period will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. The public notice of such hearings will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the public hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.
