Description of Proposed Permit Modification

The Permittee has requested an increase in the permitted disposal capacity of the Mesquite Landfill. The increase is a vertical (downward) expansion of 567,000 yds³ and extend the landfills' life to approximately 2030. As depth to groundwater is in excess of 500 feet, no changes to the Groundwater Monitoring program are being considered at this time. The expansion is in the Phase III and IV areas of the landfill. In addition, the Permittee has updated information in the application to reflect administrative changes as well.

Proposed Action

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) is proposing to approve and issue a Permit modification to accommodate the request.

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection's (NDEPs) Notice of Intent to approve a modification to the Permit for the city of Mesquite subject to the conditions contained in the Permit, will be published in the Las Vegas Review Journal. Additionally, the Public Notice will be mailed to interested persons on our mailing list. The NDEP will accept written comments and written requests for a public hearing on the proposed draft permit from all interested persons. Written requests for a public hearing must state the nature of the issues, which the requester intends to raise at the hearing. Written requests for a public hearing and written comments on the proposed draft permit will be accepted until the end of the public comment period.

Will there be a public hearing?

The NDEP may schedule a public hearing on its own initiative or based on receipt of a written request received during the public comment period. Any interested person may submit a written request to the NDEP for a public hearing on the proposed action. The request must state the nature of the issues which the requester intends to raise at the hearing. If a hearing is scheduled, the NDEP will notify all persons who are on the mailing list or who have submitted written comments on the proposed action.



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When does the comment period end?

The 30-day comment period ends at 5 p.m. on September 6th 2013. Anyone wishing to comment should do so in writing prior to this date. The NDEP may extend the comment period as deemed necessary.
