Reclamation Permit No. 0437 Schlumberger Technology Corporation Clayton Valley Lithium Exploration Project

The Administrator of the Division of Environmental Protection (Division) has decided to issue Reclamation Permit (0437) for an Exploration Project to Schlumberger Technology Corporation (Permittee). This Permit authorizes the Permittee to reclaim the Clayton Valley Lithium Exploration Project. The project is located within portions of Sections 22-29, and Sections 32-36, Township 2 South, Range 39 East; Sections 20, 28-33, Township 2 South, Range 40 East; Sections 1-5, 7-36, Township 3 South, Range 39 East; Sections 4-8, and Sections 17-19, and 30, Township 3 South, Range 40 East; Sections 1 and 12, Township 4 South, Range 38 East; Sections 1-11, Township 4 South, Range 39 East; Mount Diablo Baseline and Meridian, Esmerelda, County, Nevada. The Division has been provided with an application, in accordance with Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 519A to assure the Division that the Permittee will leave the project site safe, stable, and capable of providing for a productive post-mining land use.

This Permit becomes effective May 31, 2025. The final determination of the Administrator may be appealed to the State Environmental Commission (Commission) pursuant to NAC 519A.415. All requests for appeals must be filed by 5:00 PM, May 23, 2025, on Form 3 with the Commission at 901 South Stewart Street, Suite 4001, Carson City, Nevada 89701-5249, and in accordance with administrative rules of the Commission.

This Permit authorizes 76.3 acres of Phase I disturbance and 77.0 acres of Phase II land disturbance. A subsequent phase of disturbance is proposed of 60.0 acres that will require additional work plans and bond review. The total proposed disturbed acreage is 213.3 acres on public lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management as described in the permit application dated April 1, 2025, and entitled *Clayton Valley Lithium Exploration Project*, *BLM File Serial # NVN-100818*, *NVNV105855847*.
