

Notice of Receipt of an Application for a Permit to Construct

State of Nevada Division of Environmental Protection Chemical Accident Prevention Program

Pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 459 and the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 459, the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection hereby gives notice concerning the receipt of an application for a Permit to Construct for a facility that will be regulated under the Regulation of Highly Hazardous Substances and Explosives for the following applicant:

Ormat – Salt Wells Salt Wells Upgrade Project 6059 Salt Wells Road Fallon, Nevada 89406

Prior to commencing construction of the new process, a permit to construct must be obtained. Once in operation, **Ormat – Salt Wells** will be subject to the requirements of the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection - Chemical Accident Prevention Program (NDEP-CAPP) due to their use, storage, manufacturing, handling or onsite movement of any combination of **Isobutane** in their **Salt Wells Upgrade Project**.

Through the permitting process, NDEP-CAPP will ensure that **Ormat – Salt Wells** has:

- Developed process operating procedures and trained operations personnel;
- Developed programs to ensure mechanical integrity of process equipment;
- Developed other programs required pursuant to CAPP, designed to minimize the potential for catastrophic accidents; and,
- Coordinated emergency response activities with local responders.

- The registration submitted pursuant to NAC 459.953451;
- The coordinated emergency plan document;
- The site plan; and
- A copy of the conditional use permit.
