FEDERAL FACILITY AGREEMENT AND CONSENT ORDER

(FFACO) QUARTERLY REPORT

Background

The Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order (FFACO) is a legal document by which the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) assures citizens of Nevada that the public's health and safety, as well as the environment, are protected in regards to the Nevada National Security Site (NNSS), parts of the Nevada Test and Training Range (NTTR), parts of the Tonopah Test Range (TTR), and the two Nevada Off-Sites, Central Nevada Test Area (CNTA) and Project Shoal Area (PSA). Nevada Off-Sites are a group of sites where underground nuclear tests occurred out of the boundaries of the NNSS.

The FFACO identifies sites of potential historic contamination that require corrective actions based on public health and environmental considerations on the NNSS, the NTTR, the TTR, CNTA, and PSA.

Industrial Sites Activity

At the end of September 2025, there were 1962 historical Corrective Action Sites (CASs) (out of 1970 total) that have been closed, with three (3) CASs in Corrective Action Unit (CAU) 114 and five (5) CASs in CAU 572, all of which continue to undergo active D&D work by the Department of Energy's Environmental Management Nevada Program (EM NV).

The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection Bureau of Federal Facilities' (NDEP or BFF) staff continued document reviews, Use-Restrictions reviews, and post-closure inspections for a number of closed Industrial Sites on the Nevada National Security Site (NNSS), as described below:

Document Reviews and Letters:

CAU 572 – Test Cell C – On December 22, 2025, BFF staff received the *Draft Closure Report (CR) for Corrective Action Unit (CAU) 572: Test Cell C Ancillary Building and Structures, Nevada National Security Site (NNSS), Nevada, Revision 0, December 2025*. A response letter with comments was issued on January 22, 2026. On February 12, 2026, BFF received comment responses to the January 22, 2026, letter and requested a meeting to discuss the responses. This meeting occurred on February 26, 2026. On

March 18, 2026, BFF staff received the *Final Closure Report for Corrective Action Unit 572: Test Cell C Ancillary Building and Structures, Nevada National Security Site, Nevada, Revision 0, March 2026*. BFF issued a response letter on March 31, 2026, approving the report.

On January 20, 2026, BFF staff received the *EM Nevada (EM NV) Completion of Corrective Actions Associated with EM NV Program's Application of Point of Generation Guidance at Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order (FFACO) Site*. A response letter approving the final corrective actions was issued on January 23, 2026. The Closure Affirmation for CAU 572 Test Cell C was reviewed and approved on June 1, 2026, verifying the administrative record of CAU 572 Test Cell C.

CAU 578 – Miscellaneous Inactive Sites – On June 9, 2026, BFF staff received the *Addendum to the Closure Report for Corrective Action Unit 578: Miscellaneous Inactive Sites, Nevada National Security Site, Nevada, Revision 0, June 2026*. BFF issued a response letter on June 16, 2026, accepting and approving the addendum.

Federal Facility and Consent Order (FFACO) – On April 13, 2026, BFF staff received the *Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 – FY 2028 Planned Federal Facility Agreement and Consent Order (FFACO) Milestones and Due Dates*. BFF issued a response letter on April 22, 2026, approving the milestones and due dates.

Corrective Action Unit (CAU) Post-Closure Inspections – On April 16, 2026, BFF staff received the *Draft Non-Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Corrective Action Unit (CAU) Post-Closure Inspection Report, Nevada National Security Site, Nevada, For Calendar Year 2025, Revision 0, April 2026*. BFF issued a comment letter on April 30, 2026. Comment responses were received by BFF staff on May 13, 2026, and BFF accepted the comment responses on May 18, 2026. On May 21, 2026, BFF staff received the *Final Non-Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Corrective Action Unit (CAU) Post-Closure Inspection Report, Nevada National Security Site, Nevada, For Calendar Year 2025, Revision 0, May 2026*. BFF issued a response letter approving the final report on June 2, 2026.

Meetings and Site Visits:

A monthly FFACO meeting is held between BFF and EM NV personnel to discuss any relevant topics and the status of correspondence. Meetings were held on April 2, 2026, May 13, 2026, and June 11, 2026.

BFF staff and NDEP deputy administrator participated in DOE Legacy Management's annual inspection of closed FFACO sites at the Tonopah Test Range the week of May 4, 2026.

BFF staff observed demolition and waste packaging activities at CAU 114 EMAD on June 15, 2026.

The BFF chief and NDEP administrator attended the DOE Intergovernmental Meeting in Arlington, Virginia the week of June 22, 2026.

Soils Activity Sites

At the end of December 2019, all Soil CASs, a total of 144, had been closed.

Underground Test Area (UGTA) Activity

There are five (5) UGTA CAUs, all of which are either in the Corrective Action Decision Document/ Corrective Action Plan (Model Evaluation for UGTA sites) or in long-term monitoring during the Closure Stage. During this quarter, BFF staff participated in the process of document review, project evaluation, site visits, meetings and/or teleconferences for the UGTA Activity and CAUs 101 and 102 – Central and Western Pahute Mesa in the following ways:

Document Reviews and Letters:

On March 18, 2026, BFF staff received the *Calendar Year (CY) 2025 Post-Closure Monitoring Letter Report, Revision 0, March 2026*. A comment response letter was issued on March 31, 2026. On May 6, 2026, BFF staff received the *Final Calendar Year (CY) 2025 Post-Closure Monitoring Letter Report, Nevada National Security Site, Nevada, Revision 1, April 2026*. BFF staff issued a response letter accepting the comment responses and approving the final report on May 21, 2026.

On June 29, 2026, BFF staff received the *Draft Calendar Year 2026 Corrective Action Unit 98, Frenchman Flat, Six-Year Post-Closure Monitoring Report, Nevada National Security Site, Nevada, Revision 0, June 2026*. BFF will issue a response letter early next quarter.

Meetings and Site Visits:

Informal UGTA Discussion Meetings – A practice was begun in the beginning of 2022 of holding an “informal” Teams meeting with EM NV, Navarro, DRI and BFF staff about every six weeks to discuss present and upcoming UGTA documents or activities or any other outstanding UGTA subjects. This quarter’s meeting was held on June 17, 2026.

On April 28, 2026, and June 22, 2026, BFF staff along with Navarro personnel visited the Pahute Mesa well sites to observe well development and testing activities.

Nevada Off-Sites and the Tonopah Test Range

There are four (4) Nevada Off-Sites CAUs, two (2) Surface CAUs (CAU 416 and 417) and two (2) Subsurface CAUs (CAU 443 and 447). CAU 416 has been clean closed. CAU 417 is in Post-Closure Monitoring. CAUs 443 and 447 are in the Closure Stage. On September 30, 2020, the Office of Legacy Management (LM) assumed responsibility for the long-term surveillance and maintenance of the Tonopah Test Range (TTR) FFACO sites. NDEP activities for the TTR sites are reported under this Section.

General FFACO Business:

Use Restrictions (URs) and General FFACO Work – Throughout this quarter, BFF staff have reviewed updated URs submitted by the EM NV. Comments are offered when necessary. The Use Restriction Management Plan (URMP) will be periodically revised by the EM NV to add updated NDEP-accepted URs.

FFACO Transition – As the active investigation/remediation work under the FFACO nears completion, the Department of Energy (DOE) and NDEP have undertaken the FFACO Transition Project to ensure that any future steward of the NNSS will be aware of all post-closure monitoring requirements on the NNSS by the addition of Appendix VII to the FFACO. The Bureau Chief represents NDEP on this working group.

File Management – This quarter, staff have continued to organize, scan for electronic storage, and document files for FFACO sites.

Miscellaneous:

The chief participated in monthly NDEP Attorney General staff meetings, bi-weekly Division-Wide Chief's Staff Meetings and bi-weekly meetings with the Deputy Administrator either in person or via virtual meetings in April, May, and June 2026.

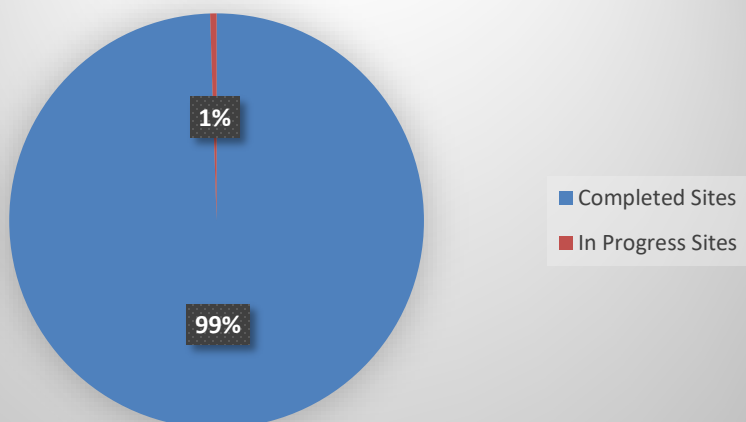

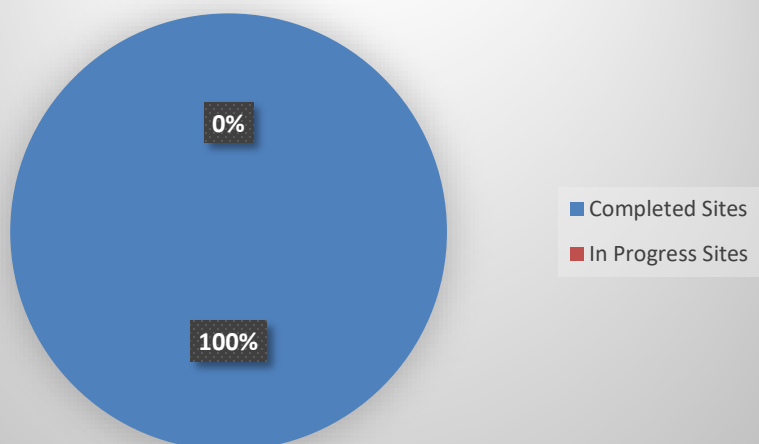

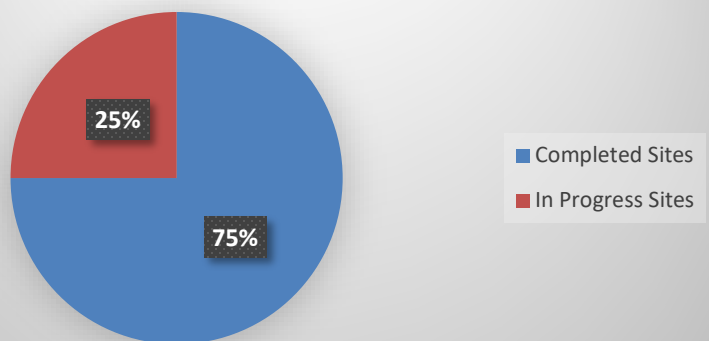
FFACO Industrial Sites

Agreement in Principle (AIP) Functional Areas Summary – Grant #DE-EM0005237 0003

Background

The Agreement in Principle (AIP) is a legal document by which the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (NDEP) assures citizens of Nevada that the public's health and safety, as well as the environment, are protected in regards to the Nevada National Security Site (NNSS). Under the AIP, the Bureau of Federal Facilities (BFF) serves as the primary point of contact for environmental compliance matters for past and ongoing operations at the NNSS.

The BFF enforces environmental regulations at the NNSS through the issuance of permits to the owner of the NNSS, Department of Energy's (DOE's) National Nuclear Security Administration/Nevada Field Office (NNSA/NFO). The BFF issues Water Pollution Control Permits GNEV93001 and NEV96001, Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Permit NEV HW0101, and Solid Waste Permits SW 532, SW 13 097 02, SW 13 097 03, and SW 13 097 04. The BFF also regulates Safe Drinking Water Permits NV0000360, NV0004098, and NV0004099.

1. On-Site Discharges - Water Pollution Control

Document Reviews and Site Inspections:

Water Pollution Control Permit GNEV93001 – The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection's (NDEP) Bureau of Federal Facilities (BFF) staff received the *Discharge Monitoring Report for Nevada National Security Site Sewage Ponds, Water Pollution Control Permit GNEV93001, January 1, 2026, Through March 31, 2026*, on April 28, 2026. BFF staff reviewed the report and issued a response letter to the National Nuclear Security Administration/Nevada Field Office (NNSA/NFO) on May 20, 2026, acknowledging the limits set forth in the permit had been met for the quarter.

On June 3, 2026, BFF issued the *2026 Annual Compliance Evaluation Inspection for WPC Permit GNEV 93001 at the Nevada National Security Site by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection*. The BFF will conduct this inspection early next quarter.

On February 4, 2026, BFF staff received the *Nevada National Security Site, Bureau of Water Pollution Control Permit Number GNEV93001, New U1A Sewer Main and Lift Station Design Drawings Submittal*. BFF issued a comment letter on March 17, 2026, requesting additional information. On May 5, 2026, BFF staff received comment responses to the March 17, 2026, letter. BFF issued a response letter on May 26, 2026, stating that all NDEP comments had been addressed and approving the submittal.

On June 22, 2026, BFF staff received the *GNEV93001 WPC Groundwater Discharge Permit Application Renewal* which included the *Delegation of Signature Authority for Reports and Requests Under the Nevada Nuclear Security Site Groundwater Discharge Permit GNEV93001*.

GNEV93001 permit renewal activities will continue next quarter.

Water Pollution Control Permit NEV96021 – BFF staff received the *E-Tunnel Wastewater Discharge Permit Quarterly Monitoring Report for First Quarter Calendar Year 2026* on April 23, 2026. BFF staff reviewed the report and issued a response letter to the NNSA/NFO on May 1, 2026, acknowledging the limits set forth in the permit had been met for the quarter.

On June 3, 2026, BFF issued the *2026 Annual Compliance Evaluation Inspection for WPC Permit NEV 96021 at the Nevada National Security Site by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection*. The BFF will conduct this inspection early next quarter.

Meetings and Site Visits:

The quarterly water meeting was held on June 17, 2026.

2. Ground Water Monitoring

There was no activity in this category during this quarter.

3. Air Quality Monitoring

There was no activity in this category during this quarter.

4. Low-Level and Mixed Low-Level Waste Oversight

Conference Calls:

Staff participated in weekly Waste Acceptance Review Panel (WARP) meetings via teleconference during April, May, and June 2026. WARP meetings include representatives from DOE, DOE contractors, NDEP, waste generators, and technical experts. Review panel members discussed waste profile comments and waste-specific compliance issues for generator-submitted low-level radioactive (LLW) and mixed low-level radioactive (MLLW) waste profiles, along with Pre-Treatment Notifications, as they pertain to Nevada National Security Site Waste Acceptance Criteria (NSSWAC), DOE/NV--325-22-00, which became effective on February 29, 2024. As applicable, BFF staff reviewed and provided comments on LLW, MLLW, classified non-radiological non-hazardous, and classified radiological hazardous waste profiles and reviewed all comment responses submitted by the currently approved waste generators. All waste sent to the NNSS for disposal proceeds through the WARP profile review process, and allows NDEP to review and provide comments on waste streams prior to disposal at the NNSS.

Profiles Reviewed:

BFF staff reviewed a total of fifteen (27) waste profiles this quarter. Twenty (20) profiles were strictly for LLW requiring disposal in Department of Energy (DOE) Order 435.1 LLW landfills. Six (6) profiles were strictly MLLW requiring disposal in the NDEP permitted RCRA cell. One (1) was non-radioactive classified hazardous waste requiring disposal in the NDEP permitted RCRA cell.

Meetings:

BFF staff participated in DOE's quarterly LLW Stakeholder's Meeting on February 11, 2026, in Las Vegas, NV.

Waste Generator Suspensions:

There is currently zero (0) waste generator suspensions.

Active Profiles:

There are currently 204 active profiles, comprised of 38 Mixed LLW/Hazardous profiles, 9 Hazardous/Non-Rad profiles, 7 Non-Rad Solid Waste profiles and 150 LLW profiles.

Suspended Profiles:

There are currently zero (0) profiles under suspension.

Site Visits/Radioactive Waste Generator Facility Evaluations:

The Radioactive Waste Acceptance Program (RWAP) conducted eight (8) surveillances, two (2) audits, one (1) visual verification, and no split sampling events this quarter. NDEP participated in six (6) surveillances, and two (2) audits this quarter as described in the sections below. NDEP's goal is to attend 70% of the RWAP audits and surveillances every quarter. By attending these audits and surveillances, NDEP personnel stay informed on how waste generators programs are performing, get first hand knowledge of any potential issues that may arise, and observe waste verification and packaging activities at generator sites prior to waste being disposed of at the NNSS.

Surveillances:

PERM – Perma-Fix Environmental, Kingston, TN - During the week of April 6, 2026, BFF personnel, along with staff from the EM NV contractor, participated in the surveillance of this waste generator. The surveillance was scheduled for DOE to verify programmatic and performance-based compliance to the NNSSWAC (DOE/NV--325- 22-00). RWAP members completed checklists specific to the elements being evaluated by conducting interviews, reviewing procedures, and conducting field inspections. NDEP personnel were provided access to interviews, procedures, and field inspections when requested. No findings and two (2) observations were issued by EM NV as a result of this surveillance.

CNS – Consolidated Nuclear Security, LLC - Y-12 National Security Complex (Y-12), Oak Ridge, TN - During the week of April 6, 2026, BFF personnel, along with staff from the EM NV contractor, participated in the surveillance of this waste generator. The surveillance was scheduled for DOE to verify programmatic and performance-based compliance to the NNSSWAC (DOE/NV--325- 22-00). RWAP members completed checklists specific to the elements being evaluated by conducting interviews, reviewing procedures, and conducting field inspections. NDEP personnel were provided access to interviews, procedures, and field inspections when requested. No findings and two (2) observations were issued by EM NV as a result of this surveillance.

AMWP – Idaho Environmental Coalition (AMWP), Idaho Falls, ID - During the week of May 4, 2026, BFF personnel, along with staff from the EM NV contractor, participated in the surveillance of this waste generator. The surveillance was scheduled for DOE to verify programmatic and performance-based compliance to the NNSSWAC (DOE/NV--325- 22-00). RWAP members completed checklists specific to the elements being evaluated by conducting interviews, reviewing procedures, and conducting field inspections. NDEP personnel were provided access to interviews, procedures, and field inspections when requested. One (1) finding and two (2) observations were issued by EM NV as a result of this surveillance.

USAA – U.S. Army Aberdeen Proving Ground (APG), Aberdeen, D - During the week of May 11, 2026, BFF personnel, along with staff from the EM NV contractor, participated in the surveillance of this waste generator. The surveillance was scheduled for DOE to verify programmatic and performance-based compliance to the NNSSWAC (DOE/NV--325- 22-00). RWAP members completed checklists specific to the elements being evaluated by conducting interviews, reviewing procedures, and conducting field inspections. NDEP personnel were provided access to interviews, procedures, and field inspections when requested. No findings or observations were issued by EM NV as a result of this surveillance.

PORT – Southern Ohio Cleanup Company, LLC, Piketon, OH - During the week of May 11, 2026, BFF personnel, along with staff from the EM NV contractor, participated in the surveillance of this waste generator. The surveillance was scheduled for DOE to verify programmatic and performance-based compliance to the NNSSWAC (DOE/NV--325- 22-00). RWAP members completed checklists specific to the elements being evaluated by conducting interviews, reviewing procedures, and conducting field inspections. NDEP personnel were provided access to interviews,

procedures, and field inspections when requested. No findings and one (1) observation were issued by EM NV as a result of this surveillance.

ORNL – UT Battelle, LLC, Oak Ridge, TN - During the week of May 11, 2026, BFF personnel, along with staff from the EM NV contractor, participated in the surveillance of this waste generator. The surveillance was scheduled for DOE to verify programmatic and performance-based compliance to the NNSSWAC (DOE/NV--325- 22-00). RWAP members completed checklists specific to the elements being evaluated by conducting interviews, reviewing procedures, and conducting field inspections. NDEP personnel were provided access to interviews, procedures, and field inspections when requested. No findings or observations were issued by EM NV as a result of this surveillance.

The audit was scheduled for DOE to verify programmatic and performance-based compliance with the NNSSWAC (DOE/NV--325-22-00). RWAP members completed checklists specific to the elements being evaluated by conducting interviews, reviewing procedures, and field inspections when requested. No findings and two (2) observations were issued by EM NV as a result of this audit.

The bureau of Federal Facilities is made up of a Bureau Chief, one supervisor, one subject matter expert, three technical staff, and an administrative assistant. The AIP grant funds activities for each of these individuals. For the quarter, that represents approximately 4.0 FTEs based on a review of grant-related activities.
