



NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION

The Administrator, Division of Environmental Protection, Carson City, Nevada is issuing the following notice of proposed action under the Nevada Revised Statutes and/or the Clean Water Act, where applicable. The Administrator has received an application for a Groundwater Discharge, permit number NS0089011 from the following applicant:

Permit NS0089011, PARADISE VALLEY SEWER DISTRICT:

The Permittee, Paradise Valley Sewer District, has applied for the renewal of its groundwater discharge permit for the Paradise Valley Wastewater Treatment Facility (facility or WWTF), located in Paradise Valley, Humboldt County, Nevada. Paradise Valley is a small agricultural community situated along State Route 290, approximately 40 miles north of Winnemucca. The local economy is supported by ranching, tourism, and seasonal hunting. The area includes a mix of full-time residences, part-time or seasonal homes, and unoccupied historic structures.

The WWTF was originally constructed in 1975 and currently consists of a flow measurement structure, a two-chamber concrete septic tank, a HDPE-lined facultative treatment pond, and active rapid infiltration basins (RIBs). The facility is designed to treat up to 5,000 gallons per day (gal/d) of domestic wastewater and discharges secondary-level effluent to the subsurface through infiltration. No new construction or infrastructure upgrades are proposed during this permit renewal cycle.

Major Modification (Effective March 2026):

Due to internal oversight the permit has been modified to change the sampling frequency of Outfall 004 parameter "Sludge/Solids, Depth" to once per permit term from Annual, the parameter Freeboard "Sample Type" has been changed to Visual from Static, and a footnote has been added to "Monitoring Loc".

On the basis of preliminary review of the requirements of the Nevada Revised Statutes, as amended, and implementing regulations, the Administrator proposes to issue Permit NS0089011 to discharge for a five (5) year period, subject to certain effluent limitations.

Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations by the Administrator regarding permit issuance should submit their comments or request, in writing, hand delivered or postmarked no later than 5:00 P.M. on 02/26/2026, either in person or by mail to:

The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person

filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final determination(s) regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.

If no hearing is held and the determinations of the Administrator are substantially changed from the tentative determinations, the Administrator will give public notice of the revised determinations. Additional comments and objections will be considered at that time.

A public hearing on the proposed determination can be requested by the applicant, any affected State, any affected interstate agency, the Regional Administrator of EPA Region IX or any interested agency, person or group of persons. The request must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. Any public hearing determined by the Administrator to be held must be conducted in the geographical area of the proposed discharge or any other area the Administrator determined to be appropriate. All public hearings must be conducted in accordance with NAC 445A.238.
