The purpose of this project is to improve stabilization of the existing Hobart Reservoir Dam and emergency spillway to reduce potential impacts from seismic hazards that could affect the critical drinking water infrastructure and downstream properties. The Nevada State Public Works Division (NPWD) is proposing to make repairs to the Hobart Reservoir Dam, an earthen embankment dam located just downstream of the confluence of Hobart Creek and Frankton Creek in Washoe County. The proposed improvements include dredging 11,220 – 47,394 cubic yards of accumulated sediment/organic matter within the reservoir, replacing the existing outlet pipes with an enlarged, single-barrel, concrete encased welded steel primary outlet, replacing the existing outlet structure with a screened reinforced concrete structure, replacing the manually operated valves on the outlet pipe with an actuator-controlled slide gate, replacing the existing emergency spillway structure with a cast-in-place concrete spillway, elevating the dam crest by approximately 2.0 feet, constructing a chimney drain and toe drain for seepage collection and management, and stabilizing the dam with compacted embankment fill. The project proponent has requested certification for the use of Nationwide Permit 3 (Maintenance) and Nationwide Permit 33 (Temporary Construction, Access, and Dewatering) administered by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

A 401 certification (or a waiver of certification) is required for any federal license or permit that authorizes activities that may result in any discharge into waters of the United States. Nevada Division of Environmental Protection is in receipt of a complete request for certification in compliance with Clean Water Act Section 401 Certification regulations which the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency promulgated in 2023, codified as 40 CFR 121.

The Administrator is evaluating whether the proposed activity will comply with applicable water quality requirements. Certification actions are valid for the duration of the federal license or permit (typically five years). Any conditions contained within the certification action become a condition of the federal license or permit.

Persons wishing to comment on the application for consideration by the Administrator in making a determination regarding the certification action should submit their comments or request a hearing in writing, emailed no later than 5:00 P.M. on 9/11/2025:

The request for a hearing must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All water quality-related comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final certification action regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.
