The purpose of this project is to mitigate and reverse the negative impacts of the Jake's Fire in Elko County, Nevada. The proposed goals are to improve riverscape health, specifically: 1) increase channel-floodplain connectivity, 2) reduce channel incision, 3) increase groundwater table, 4) promote the formation of multi-threaded channels, 5) recover and sustain natural habitat forming processes, and 6) increase habitat and overall health of Lahontan Cutthroat Trout populations. The proposed project would result in 766 low-tech instream structures including beaver dam analogs (BDAs) and post-assisted log structures (PALS) and would follow the established methodology of Wheaton et al. (2019). All instream work would occur during the summer and fall low-flow window (typically July 1 to Oct 31) to avoid critical spring spawning, migration, and egg incubation periods. Structures (BDAs and PALS) would be installed manually using hand tools and lightweight power equipment (e.g., chainsaws and post-pounders), eliminating the need for heavy earthmoving equipment and avoiding mechanical dewatering, stream diversions, or accelerated bank erosion. The project proponent has requested certification for the use of Regional General Permit 16 (Aquatic Habitat Restoration and Enhancement Activities) under Clean Water Act Section 404 administered by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

A 401 certification (or a waiver of certification) is required for any federal license or permit that authorizes activities that may result in any discharge into waters of the United States. Nevada Division of Environmental Protection is in receipt of a complete request for certification in compliance with Clean Water Act Section 401 Certification regulations which the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency promulgated in 2023, codified as 40 CFR 121.

The Administrator is evaluating whether the proposed activity will comply with applicable water quality requirements. Certification actions are valid for the duration of the federal license or permit (typically five

years). Any conditions contained within the certification action become a condition of the federal license or permit.

Persons wishing to comment on the application for consideration by the Administrator in making a determination regarding the certification action should submit their comments or request a hearing in writing, emailed no later than 5:00 P.M. on 8/13/2026:

The request for a hearing must be filed within the comment period and must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. All water quality-related comments or objections received within the thirty (30) day period will be considered in the formulation of final certification action regarding the application. If written comments indicate a significant degree of public interest in the proposed permit, the Administrator shall hold a public hearing. A public notice of such hearing will be issued not less than thirty (30) days prior to the hearing date.
