Henderson Former Police Department Firing Range Henderson, Clark County

SITE BACKGROUND

The City of Henderson applied for and was awarded funding through the Nevada Brownfields Program (NBP) for technical assistance in assessing and remediating a 3.2 acre property formerly used as a small-arms firing range for police officer training. Use of the firing range began in 1976 and ended in approximately 2000. In 2002, a limited number of soil samples were collected at the site to assess potential impacts on soil. The results indicated the presence of lead contaminated soil in the berms.

SITE INVESTIGATIONS

A Phase II Environmental Site Assessment was conducted to evaluate the nature and extent of total lead on the site.

Excavation of a 600 cubic yards of the northern berm was performed to remove soil containing lead at concentrations above 800 mg/kg. Confirmation soil samples and quality control samples were collected, which resulted in the excavation of an additional 20 cubic yards of contaminated soil. All contaminated soil was transported and disposed of offsite.
