

BROWNFIELDS PROGRAM PROJECT FACT SHEET

Las Vegas Armory Clark County

SITE BACKGROUND

This 157,000 square foot site was historically used by the Nevada National Guard as an armory. The site was developed with four permanent structures, three metal sheds on concrete pads, and a mobile office. Among the buildings were a petroleum, oils, and lubricants building and a hazardous material storage building.

Previous investigations included a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, Tier I Environmental Site Assessment, and Tier II Environmental Site Assessment, all conducted in 1999. The assessments identified 600 cubic yards of soil that was impacted by Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons (TPH).



450 tons of contaminated soil was removed and transported for treatment and disposal offsite. Confirmation samples indicate no residual contamination on site.
