Nevada Division of Environmental Protection Bureau of Mining Regulation and Reclamation Small Mining Operation Documentation Filing

(This documentation filing is <u>only</u> for a Nevada reclamation permit exemption under 519A regulations)

Nevada Revised Statutes 519A.120 defines a "small mining operation" as a person who has a combined disturbance of less than 5 acres of land in any calendar year. The Nevada Division of Environmental Protection (Division) Bureau of Mining Regulation & Reclamation (BMRR), is authorized to collect the following information from small mining operations, pursuant to Nevada Administrative Code 519A.410. This information must be provided to the BMRR Reclamation Branch prior to disturbing the surface of the land by a new small mining operation.

 Provide a representative map/topographic map of the proposed project area depicting the total affected surface acres with an <i>estimate</i> of the acreage affected by each mine component disturbance. See below: The map must define the surface land ownership of private and public land. The map must identify the proposed disturbance acres within a defined project boundary area. Define the proposed affected land by mine disturbance type: Examples: mine processing components to include heap leach pads and tailings impoundments, waste rock dumps, buildings, access roads, and any other affected land from mine surface facilities.
