State Revolving Fund Loan Programs

What must be included in the signage

Standard signage includes:

- The name of the facility, project, and community
- Project cost
- The State Agency/SRF administering the program
- The EPA and State agency logos.
 - EPA logo accompanied by a statement indicating that recipient received financial assistance from EPA for the project.

Posters and brochures include

- Name of facility, project, and community
- State SRF administering the program
- Project is wholly or partially funded with EPA funding
- Brief description of project
- Brief description of the water quality benefits the project will achieve

Suggested language

“Construction of upgrades and improvements to the [name of facility, project location, or WWTP] were financed by the [Clean Water/Drinking Water] State Revolving Fund. The [CWSRF/DWSRF] program is administered by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection with joint funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Nevada. This project will [description of project] and will provide water quality benefits [details specifying benefits] for community residents and businesses near and in [name of town, city, and water body or watershed to benefit from project.] [CWSRF/DWSRF] programs operate around the country to provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects our valuable water resources nationwide.”

This project is administered by the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection with joint funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Nevada.
