- Goldfield is supplied by groundwater wells approximately 12 miles north of town. Until 2019 the entire 12 miles of transmission line was 6-inch asbestos cement (AC).
- Projects over the last few years have replaced in excess of 11 miles of the AC transmission with 10-inch PVC.
- 5,000 feet of the 43-year-old 6-inch AC still needs to be replaced
- The system also includes a 366,000-gallon welded steel storage tank, built in 2002. A PER from 2014 and dive report from November 2025 identified necessary repair and recoating.

*This proposed project will:*

- 1. Replace 5,000 linear feet of 6-inch asbestos cement with new 6-inch C900 PVC water main. This will include five gate valves, fire hydrants, air valves, connections to existing main lines, and abandonment of the old mains.*
